To Intermediate (50/70) District Champions:

I'd like to congratulate your team on successfully advancing to the next level of tournament play. We in District 35 hope your experience in our district will be enjoyable and successful. I have attached the Tournament Bracket, Announcer's List and Northern California Dress Code.

The Intermediate (50/70) Section 1 tournament will be played at the Mark West Elementary School 50/70 Field at Mark West Youth Club LL in Santa Rosa, CA. The facility address is 4600 Lavell Road, Santa Rosa, CA 95403. MWYCLL's fields have grandstands, restrooms, and a full-service snack bar.

Managers are expected to "check-in" with tournament staff upon arrival at the facility each game. <u>Affidavit</u> <u>Binders (with ALL supporting documentation) will be checked and re-verified prior to your first game and must</u> <u>conform to Little League Headquarters standards</u>. The Affidavit Binders must also include:

- All players must have a signed LL Medical Release and Concussion Awareness form.
- All participants must have a signed LL Form Release and Waiver (formerly Model Release).
- All managers and coaches must have Concussion Awareness, Abuse Awareness and Sudden Cardiac Arrest training certificates.

Bring your Affidavit Binder (with all supporting documents) to each game. You cannot play without it.

As covered by Tournament Rules, home/visitor will be determined by a coin toss at least one (1) hour prior to game time. Home/visitor dugouts are pre-determined by the host field. (Note: you <u>do not</u> have choice of dugout.) Managers and coaches may be asked to show a government approved photo ID to gain access to field.



NORTHERN CALIFORNIA TOURNAMENT DRESS CODE

Little League Baseball – Docker-type pants, slacks or hemmed shorts are required for managers and coaches; no denim-type pants/shorts or camo pants/shorts will be allowed. Gusseted pockets on cargo-type shorts should lay flat. Shorts, including cargo-type shorts, MUST be no higher than 2 inches above the knees and no lower than the knees. The pants, slacks or shorts must be the same color for the manager and coaches. Collared shirts or team jersey/tee shirts are required and should be tucked in the pants. No tank tops are allowed.

Intermediate/Junior/Senior League – Managers and coaches may wear full uniforms. If not in full uniform, the same dress code for Little League Baseball will apply here.

ALL LEVELS: No open toe shoes or sandals will be allowed.

ALL LEVELS: Team hats are required for the manager and coaches.

Any manager or coach who does not conform to the Dress Code will not be allowed on the playing field before or during the game.

The purpose of the Dress Code is to insure an acceptable uniform appearance of all participants and to promote a positive role model for the players and spectators at the tournament sites. The host District Administrator, or his/her designee (e.g. ADA or Tournament Director) at the tournament site, will use their discretion in determining what is appropriate within the guidelines of the Dress Code and their determination is <u>final</u> for their tournament site.
